

Dear siblings in Christ,

The words “Tell me something good” feel especially meaningful as we enter the season of Lent. They sound simple, almost playful — and yet they echo a deep longing many of us carry. We are surrounded daily by heavy headlines, personal worries, uncertain futures, and weary hearts. Even when life is good, it often feels easier to name what is broken than what is beautiful. So this Lent, we are choosing to lean into a sacred question: Where is the good God is still bringing to life among us?

Lent is a season the church has observed for centuries as a time of reflection, prayer, and spiritual honesty. It lasts forty days and leads us toward Easter. Historically, Lent has been understood as a season of preparation — a time to slow down, to examine our lives, to notice what needs healing, and to make space for God to do renewing work within us. It is not meant to be gloomy or punishing. Instead, Lent invites us to tell the truth about who we are, to acknowledge both the dust and the delight of being human, and to remember that transformation rarely happens without intention.

This year, as we walk the Lenten path together, we will be paying special attention to goodness — not shallow optimism, but the kind of goodness that shows up even in hard places. We will explore stories, practices, and testimonies that remind us God is still creating, still restoring, still speaking life where it is most needed. Sometimes the good we discover will be quiet: a changed heart, a reconciled relationship, a new awareness of grace. Sometimes it will be bold: justice pursued, mercy extended, hope reclaimed.

My prayer is that this season will help us become a people who know how to look for God’s goodness without denying the world’s pain. A people who can sit with struggle and still say, “God is here.” A people who can name what is hard and still ask, “Tell me something good.” Because often, when we begin asking that question, we start noticing answers that were there all along.

As Lent unfolds, I invite you to enter this season with curiosity and courage. Come to worship expecting to be challenged and comforted. Come to prayer willing to be honest. Come to conversation ready to listen. And come trusting that God, who is always at work, still has something good to reveal.

Dear Disciples of Christ,

Lent invites us to slow down and pay attention — to our lives, our habits, our relationships, and our walk with God. Often, when we pause long enough to truly notice, we become aware of both what is heavy and what is holy. This year, as our congregation leans into the theme “Tell Me Something Good,” we are reminded that goodness is not something we manufacture. It is something we receive — and something we are invited to share.

Stewardship begins with noticing. Noticing where God has already been generous. Noticing the ways our lives have been shaped by grace. Noticing what gifts we carry that might become blessings for someone else. When we steward our finances, our time, our abilities, and our compassion, we are not simply managing resources — we are participating in the good work God is already doing.

This Lent, we invite you to reflect prayerfully on a simple set of questions: Where have I seen goodness lately? What has God placed in my care? How might my giving — in whatever form it takes — become a way of telling something good about who God is?

Sometimes our offerings support ministries that feed, teach, shelter, and encourage. Sometimes they support the quiet, faithful work of prayer, care, and presence. All of it matters. All of it tells a story. And each gift becomes part of the testimony of goodness that God is writing through this church.

What Is Lent?

Lent is a season the church has observed for centuries as a time of reflection, prayer, and preparation. It lasts forty days and leads us toward Easter. During Lent, Christians around the world slow down, take an honest look at their lives, and make space for God's renewing work.

Some people choose to let go of habits that distract them from God. Others take on practices like prayer, generosity, study, or service. The goal is not self-improvement for its own sake, but deeper connection — with God, with others, and with the person God is shaping us to become.

Lent reminds us that transformation is possible, grace is real, and the resurrection is coming.


First Sunday Worship
